Re: Mail ballot return envelope signature discrepancy

We have received your voted ballot for the November 3, 2020 General Election. Colorado Election Law requires us to compare the signature on your return envelope with the signatures in your voter registration record in order to verify your identity. Unfortunately, we were unable to verify your signature and require confirmation that you returned a ballot to our office.

In order for your ballot to count, you must complete, sign, and return the enclosed form by **November 12, 2020**. Please note that you may also be required to return a photocopy of your identification.

If you indicate that you have not voted a ballot, or if you fail to return the enclosed form, we will not count this ballot. If your ballot contained a signature that was not verifiable, and you do not affirm on the enclosed form that you voted a ballot, we will also turn over this discrepancy to the District Attorney's Office for investigation.

Acceptable Forms of Identification

- A valid Colorado driver's license, except a license issued under part 5 of article 2 of title 42, C.R.S.;
- A valid identification card issued by the department of revenue in accordance with the requirements of part 3 of article 2 of title 42, C.R.S.;
- A valid United States passport;
- A valid employee identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the United States government or of this state, or by any county, municipality, board, authority, or other political subdivision of this state;
- A valid pilot's license issued by the federal aviation administration or other authorized agency of the United States;
- A valid United States military identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector;
- A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the name and address of the elector;
- A valid Medicare or Medicaid card issued by the United States health care financing administration;
- A certified copy of a birth certificate for the elector issued in the United States;
- Certified documentation of naturalization;
- A valid student identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector issued by an institution of higher education in Colorado, as defined in section 23-3.1-102 (5), C.R.S.;
- A valid veteran identification card issued by the United States department of Veterans Affairs veterans health administration with a photograph of the eligible elector; or
- A valid identification card issued by a federally recognized tribal government certifying tribal membership.
- Verification that a voter is a resident of a group residential facility, as defined in subsection (18.5) of this section, shall be considered sufficient identification for the purposes of section 1-7-110 (1).
- Verification that a voter is a person committed to the department of human services and confined and eligible to register and vote shall be considered sufficient identification of such person for the purposes of section 1-2-210.5.
- Written correspondence from the county sheriff or his or her designee to the county clerk indicating that a voter is confined in a jail or detention facility.
